“The Giving Snowman” at the Bryant –Mamaroneck Park Storywalk

White Plains, NY – January 10, 2023- We are excited to announce the posting of a new book along the Bryant- Mamaroneck Storywalk Trail for the winter. “The Giving Snowman” written by Julia Zheng, Illustrated by Graziella Miligi. The book tells the story of a snowy night when a Snowman lends a helping hand to a Bird, a Rabbit, a Farmer, and a Traveler when they are in need. The next day when the sun comes out and melts Snowman, Bird, Rabbit, Farmer, and Traveler work together as a team to rebuild Snowman. The Giving Snowman is a book about kindness and gratitude. Children can learn through the story that giving to others is a virtue that connects all of us and makes our lives more beautiful.

The City of White Plains Recreation and Parks Department, in partnership with the White Plains Public Library, has been pleased to present *StoryWalk* at Bryant-Mamaroneck Park. The *StoryWalk* combines a children's story with a popular walking route. Children's books are selected, the pages separated, laminated, and placed along a walking path at regular intervals so readers can follow the story as they walk the route. The *StoryWalk* is a great opportunity for parents, teachers, and caregivers to provide a fun and healthy activity for young children.

The Bryant-Mamaroneck Park is located on the corner of Bryant and Mamaroneck Avenues. The park entrance is on the Mamaroneck Avenue side.
